Sidonie Smith is the Lorna G. Goodson Distinguished University Professor of English and Women's Studies at the University of Michigan. She is Past President of the Modern Language Association. Her fields of interest include human rights and personal narrative, women's autobiography, women's travel narrative and memory, women's studies in literature more generally, feminist theory, and postcolonial literatures.

Julia Watson is Professor Emerita of Comparative Studies and former Associate Dean of Arts and Sciences at The Ohio State University. She is also a core faculty member of Project Narrative at OSU. Her recent essays explore graphic memoir, posthumanism, voice, and testimony and online life narrative. She has cowritten with Sidonie Smith *Reading Autobiography: A Guide for Interpreting Life Narratives*.
